From the Superintendent's desk...

Dear Joliet Community,

The repeated phrase this year was, "Difficult does not mean impossible." It was our approach as we nurtured each other, managed onerous scenarios with jurisprudence, and strengthened our purpose for learning. The entire Joliet community gave special care to the well-being of students and staff, and the school was able to keep its doors open all year for in-person instruction. As a result, we are a stronger and more resilient educational community, and I am grateful for the sustained fortitude exerted by all.

Unlike previous years, this was the whopper to test moral absolutes. The things I vowed never to do, and the things I vowed always to do as a school leader were sometimes at odds with the pandemic restrictions and mandates. Despite the challenges, many opportunities that never existed before became readily available. For instance, the Joliet School District received federal funding to provide free breakfast and lunch to all students enrolled. This federal funding was extended for 2021-22, so breakfast and lunch is free to all K-12 students again this year. COVID-19 relief funds also made facility projects, technology purchases and new summer programs possible. These funds, in addition to the technology levy and building reserve levy, have allowed advancements that would otherwise be unfeasible. We were able to purchase more Chromebooks and laptops, which moved us closer to our one-to-one goal, and it allowed us to embark on needed facility and ground maintenance. We will continue to embrace these opportunities as applications and grants become accessible.

There were other remarkable changes as a result of the public health crisis, such as new vocabulary and catch phrases. One of the phrases frequently used is "learning loss". Educational forums and news feeds across the nation reference the detriments of distance learning. Due to Joliet's ability to keep the schoolhouse doors open and its ability to offer consistent programming while employing a distance learning coordinator, we actually fared better than most. Based on the Measure of Academic Progress (MAP), which is a computerized adaptive test students take to help us make informed decisions regarding academic growth, the Joliet students are doing well. Our spring test scores for Kindergarten through 12th grade revealed that 77% of our students are at or above average in math, and 66% are at or above average in reading. This is based on nationwide data of same-aged students taking the MAP test.

To highlight other developments, our Transformational Learning grant will open varied pathways for students this year. Mrs. Hernandez will continue in her administrative role as the Dean of Students, high school students will be able to drive off-campus for lunch for the first time ever, and the Joliet School District will welcome five new teachers.

Callie Atkinson comes to Joliet with a breadth of English experiences. She boasts a BA and two MFAs, one in Poetry and the other in Fiction. Callie recently acquired her teaching endorsement from the University of Montana. She completed her student teaching in Belfry and also worked there as a substitute teacher.

Isaac Fritz will be taking the reins of the high school social studies department. Mr. Fritz spent last year as the 5th through 12th grade social studies teacher in Ryegate. He holds a Bachelor degree in History from Montana State University as well as his teaching endorsement. He brings a wide variety of outdoor working experiences, including river work in Alaska and Kenya, to the team.

Cailen Herriford has been hired as the new science teacher. Her research areas include DNA extraction, working with scorpions and venom, and researching *Arabidopsis thaliana*, among others. Cailen brings a Bachelor of Science in Biology to the team and she is currently working towards her teaching endorsement and a Master's Degree in education. Cailen lives in the Joliet area and is a Joliet High School alum.

Tracy MacArthur has been hired as our second 4th grade teacher. Tracy brings over five years of experience to the classroom in multiple grade levels and content areas. Tracy earned a Bachelor of Arts in Journalism from Eastern Washington University and her Masters in Teaching from Grand Canyon University. Tracy and her family will be moving to the area from Washington state.

Annie Olson is joining the team as our 6th grade ELA teacher. Annie earned a Bachelors of Arts in Elementary Education from Rocky Mountain College in 2020. She spent the 2020-2021 school year working as an paraprofessional and long term substitute teacher in 1st grade. Annie is also a J-Hawk grad!

From Mr. Begger...

"The plane stays up because it doesn't have time to fall." - The Wright Brothers

As I look toward the start of the 2021-2022 school year, I can't help but think how proud I am to be a Jhawk. This past school year was filled with challenges that many of us could never have imagined. Our community showed the resilience that defines our spirit time and time again. I truly believe that the state of education in Joliet is strong.

From a curriculum standpoint, our teachers continue to be innovative and responsive to current educational best practices. Many teachers have adopted small group, centers based instruction which allows teachers to meet the individual needs of students and for students to become self-navigating learners and take ownership over their learning. In K-5 math classrooms, teachers will be implementing a new textbook series, which was rigorously vetted through 2 years of work by the District's math textbook adoption committee. That committee included teachers, parents, and school board members. From a social-emotional learning perspective, the District again received the PAX Exemplar School Grant and will continue to implement PAX strategies in our PK-5 classrooms.

In the middle school, we will be transitioning all students back to the traditional grading model based on the A-F scale. Standards based instruction and assessment will continue to be the hallmark of instruction, but teachers will report progress using the traditional scale. Additionally, our 6th through 8th grade social studies offerings are now aligned with updated textbooks. The middle school math program will also see a new textbook series that is more aligned with our high school textbook series. Further, we will aim to improve our middle school ICU program, which helps to ensure every student completes every assignment, by streamlining our parent outreach platforms.

Our grit role models for the 2021-2022 school year will be the Wright Brothers, Orville and Wilbur, who, 120 years ago, were working feverishly to become the first humans to fly. When asked how the plane can fly, Orville responded, "because it doesn't have time to fall." Similarly, Jhawks SOAR because we don't have time to fall.

MIDDLE SCHOOL SCHEDULING

The district will handle all scheduling for your student(s) before the beginning of the 2021-2022 school year. 6th and 7th grade students will be enrolled in math, science, English, social studies, PE/Health, Art/JMG (Jobs for Montana Graduates), and the choice of either band, choir, and/or study hall. 8th graders will be enrolled in math, science, English, social studies, PE/Health, Art/JMG, and Ag Ed/Media Arts.

Please talk with your child regarding their choice of either band, choir, or study hall. Band runs on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday. Choir runs on Tuesday and Thursday. Students may elect band and/or choir. Students electing only band or choir will be enrolled in a study hall during off days. Students will be asked to communicate their choice to their first period teacher on the first day of school.

Middle school students are asked to assemble on the playground at 8am on the first day of school, August 25th, to get their schedules from their first period teachers.

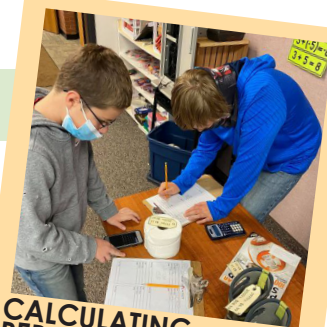
